ALBERT PARK BRANCH SEWER UPGRADE DEAKIN STREET WORKS – SE WATER

For all residents in the immediate neighbourhood of Deakin Street, according to the website, Stage 2b is scheduled to be completed in May 2025. But due to permit and approval delays they will be back later in the year to finish installing the last section of pipe between Deakin St and Cowderoy St (under Jacoby Reserve). Date yet to be advised.

PEAK HOUR TRAFFIC CONGESTION

The six-month trial of a No Right Turn from Canterbury Rd to Cowderoy St during peak hours closed last year. Local residents had noticed a marked reduction in traffic congestion and dangerous driving so it was disappointing that our then Councillors decided to call the trial unsuccessful, contrary to the official report from Council traffic engineers.

The Council discontinued the trial without putting forward an alternate solution, setting us back to the same sorry situation suffered by residents over many years: traffic congestion on our minor streets and the dangerous rat racing that it encourages. WSKRA will continue to press Council for a solution to this long-standing, high-priority community issue.

THE BEACONSFIELD HOTEL

The Beaconsfield Hotel is an acknowledged part of our neighbourhood, the historic pub has been largely vacant and deteriorating over the past years.

Although the consensus of those aware of the planned reopening of the hotel seems to be positive, there are concerns about how the hotel will affect residents who live close by. Questions have been asked about parking, hours of operation, the lack of new noise solutions, and the lack of adequate refurbishment investment by the operators.

The Application is now subject to a VCAT hearing due in the middle of this year.

ADDRESSING HOONING WITH BEACON COVE NEIGHBOURHOOD GROUP

WSKRA, along with other resident groups, local government and policy reps are members of the State Government Hooning Reference Group. This group has been developing recommendations raised by residents and the community. WSKRA and Beacon Cove Neighbourhood Group have been pushing for the introduction of acoustic cameras and on-the-spot noise testers. We will continue to advocate in this Group.

GRAND PRIX

The Australian Grand Prix has come and gone again this year and Albert Park has finally been returned to our community, albeit with a few areas of grass needing refurbishment.

The Victorian State Government funded upgrade to the pit lane facilities is now scheduled to begin after the 2026 race. This upgrade also promises 7 indoor sports courts for the local community, and improved facilities for clubs using the outdoor fields.

Please let us know if you have been affected by the Grand Prix: changes to public transport, noise, particularly from helicopter joyrides, or parking and traffic. WSKRA will raise your concerns with the myriad of responsible authorities.
